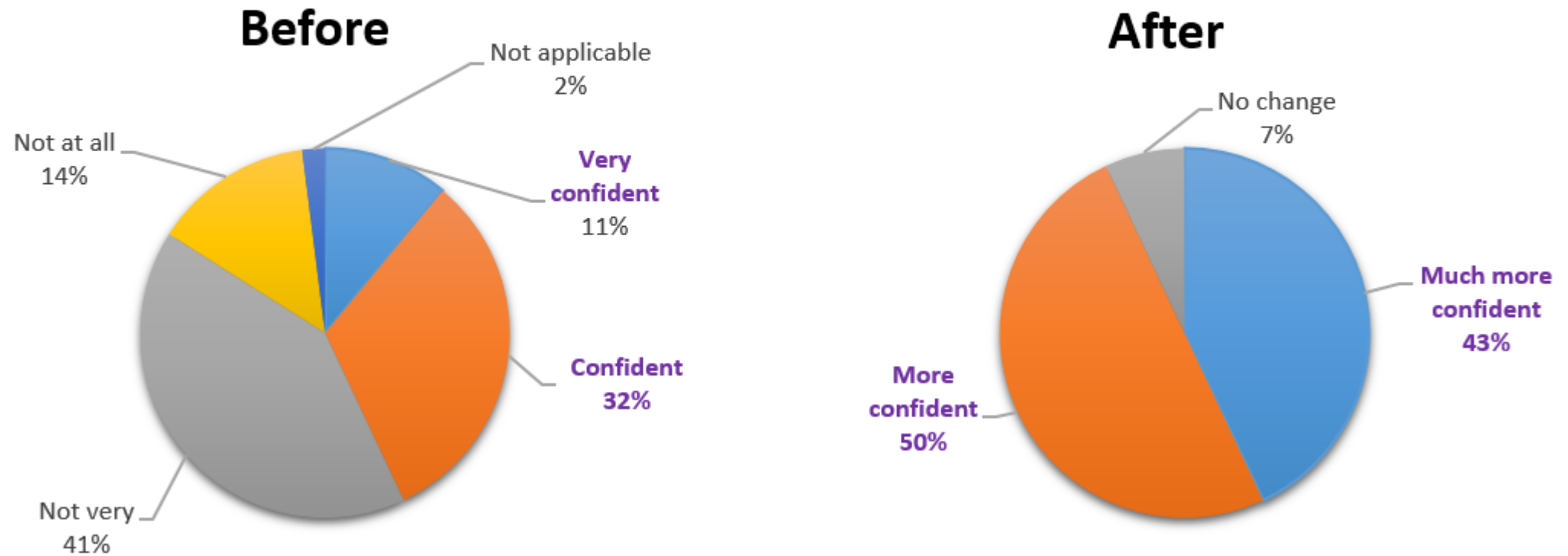

1. How confident are you now in the research/information skills?

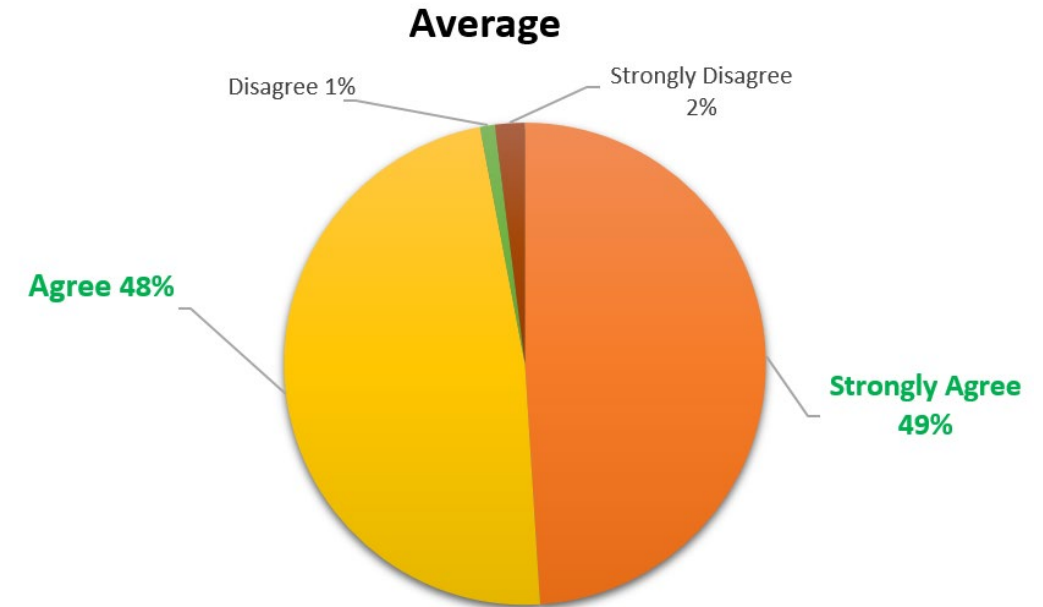
Overall, **93%** of the students found themselves **much more/more** confident.

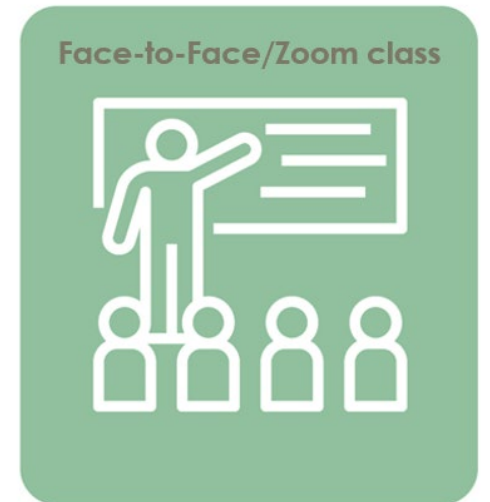


- **6 modules developed from 4 main modules in the 2nd year since its launch**
