4. Information Literacy Courses for CUHK Students: October – December 2012

The University Library will offer intensive courses from October to December 2012 to assist students in preparing for the Information Literacy Section of the Student IT Proficiency Test.

- Repeated content




Digital and Information Literacy Framework

- a theoretical framework suggested by the Open University (UK) in 2012.

"Digital literacy includes the ability to find and use information (otherwise known as information literacy) but goes beyond this to encompass communication, collaboration and teamwork, social awareness in the digital environment, understanding of e-safety and creation of new information."



Digital and Information Literacy Framework







- Launched in 2014 Semester 1
- Help students to visualize digital literacy information concepts and skills ind Resources
- Teaches how to properly and efficiently find, utilize, evaluate, legally share and create content using digital technologies

- Young, undergraduate population

Assessment:

- A small quiz for each module
- To evaluate students understanding of the content
- Module approach not necessary to complete all 5 quizzes in one go
- Backend database will record which quiz the student has taken and the quiz result
